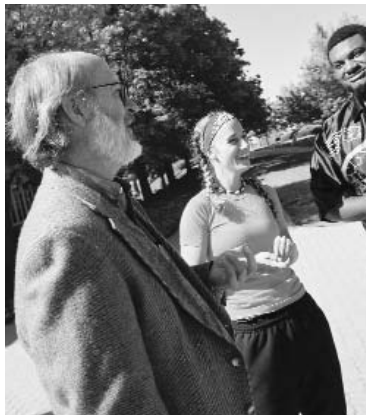

## WE CHANGE LIVES!

One of the oldest private colleges in Maryland, McDaniel College's 160-acre scenic campus covers a hilltop overlooking Westminster. The College of the liberal arts and sciences enrolls about 1,600 undergraduates from 23 states and 19 foreign countries who learn to think, to question, and to seek solutions in classes that average 17 students. More than 1,100 graduate students are enrolled each semester.

Located in the Baltimore-Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, McDaniel offers students access to the vast resources of the city and the nation's capital, 30 miles and 56 miles away. Every student has leadership opportunities in the classroom as well as in more than 100 clubs, organizations and athletic teams.

All classes, labs, and studios are taught by McDaniel's distinguished faculty, not graduate assistants. More than 95 fulltime professors - 96 percent with terminal degrees in their fields - serve as mentors to students both inside and outside of the classroom. Faculty/student collaborative research is the norm with 216 projects across all disciplines in 2003-2004. Many of McDaniel's students are published authors by the time they receive their bachelor's degrees. These accomplishments serve as springboards into professional studies, often garnering full tuition scholarships and stipends as the students pursue their doctorates.

Students choose from more than 60 fields of study. If nothing among the traditional majors and minors matches their interests, they are encouraged to design their own major. The results range from Bio-Medical Illustration to Sports Journalism, from Art in Deaf Culture to Criminal Psychology.

The tradition of the liberal arts rests comfortably at McDaniel. A flexible liberal arts curriculum stresses the ability to think critically and creatively, to act humanely and responsibly, and to be expressive. Accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, it is one of 40 colleges nationally recognized in former New York Times education editor Loren Pope's book, "Colleges that Change Lives." McDaniel's graduate school is recognized internationally for its program that trains teachers for the deaf.

McDaniel athletic teams compete in NCAA Division III as a member of the Centennial Conference, a group of 11 national liberal arts colleges and universities, including Swarthmore, Johns Hopkins, and Haverford. Women compete in 12 sports including basketball, cross-country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, indoor/outdoor track, and volleyball. Men also compete in 12 sports including baseball, basketball, cross-country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming, tennis, indoor/outdoor track, and wrestling. Additionally, there are numerous intramural and club sports and a Lifetime Fitness Center.

During the 2003-2004 academic year, McDaniel athletes earned Centennial Championship honors in indoor/outdoor track, golf, swimming, and wrestling. Teams taking home conference championships are

softball, women's basketball, and women's golf.

McDaniel's athletic facilities are exemplary with new artificial turf on Hoffa Field at Bair Stadium, a cost split by the College and the NFL Ravens, who set up training camp on campus each summer. A nine-hole golf course provides not only a practice course for the

golf teams and recreational golfers but also attracts folks from both town and College who bring sleds and snowboards when snow covers its hills. Of course, from spring to fall, golfers tee-off on the par-35 course with a 625-yard, par-5 hole, a practice putting green, a chipping green, and a sand bunker as well as a full-swing teaching area.

Academics and athletics find a successful balance in McDaniel's close-knit community. Classrooms wired with cutting-edge technology and the state-of-the-art Hoover Library support the academic endeavors of students. Every academic building on campus is either new or renovated in the past 10 years. The newest academic building next to Hoover Library was dedicated on October 1st. The departments of Graduate and Professional Studies, Education, Psychology, and Student Academic Support Services will move in upon its completion in the spring of 2005.

McDaniel College is a living-learning community known for its innovation and independence. The philosophy and mission of the College extends to its Budapest campus - and students participating in dozens of study-abroad programs bring part of the College with them. Here, on its stunning campus, McDaniel's ideals thrive - and change forever the lives of its students.

McDaniel College offers an Athletics Program for student-athletes who love their sport and those who love the freedom to explore everything college life has to offer. McDaniel College competes in the Centennial Conference, a Division III league dedicated to putting academics first. The 11-member conference which includes Johns Hopkins, Gettysburg, Haverford, Swarthmore, Dickinson, and Franklin & Marshall, came together in 1993 to allow students to pursue excellence in both sports and academic studies.

With 24 varsity teams, McDaniel is one of only two Centennial Conference schools competing for the league title in every sport offered. It is also one of the few with an Exercise Science and Physical Education major for students thinking of careers in coaching, teaching, athletic training, physical therapy, sports medicine, or health club management. More than a quarter of McDaniel College's 1,600 full-time undergraduates compete on varsity teams. Many others take part in 10 different intramural sports or take activity courses ranging from archery to kayaking.

The facilities are extensive -- the NFL's Baltimore Ravens hold their training camp here -- but the campus is small, the atmosphere is friendly, and the gyms and playing fields are no more than a two-minute walk from the dorms.

McDaniel sports its own nine-hole golf course and swimming pool, seven playing fields, including a state-of-the-art Sportex Momentum Turf System in Scott S. Bair Stadium, and eight new tennis courts. There is also the Gill Center with its five basketball/volleyball courts and two indoor tennis courts, a Life Fitness Center with up-to-date equipment for everyone from hard-core weight-trainers to weekend treadmills.

This small college makes a big impact nationally as six of the 24 varsity programs were represented in the NCAA National Championships this past year while a handful of athletes were recognized as All-Americans in their sports. Multi-sport star, Broderick Maybank won the College's seventh National Championship in the spring of 2004 as the nation's best long-jumper. Competing in the Centennial Conference, regarded as the "Ivy League" of small colleges, the Green Terror captured its third women's basketball title in four years, its fourth women's golf championship in as many years, and second men's golf championship since 2000. A large contingent of individuals brought home conference championships as well.

Our successes are not limited to trophies and medals. Nationally acclaimed media has prominently featured two of our athletes. Pardon the Interruption's Michael Wilbon featured our 2004 women's basketball team captain in the *Washington Post*, while NCAA On Campus highlighted our two-time national qualifying heavyweight on its March 2004 edition, shot here on the Hill.



In addition to being excellent athletes, those who don the Green and Gold excel in the classroom. This past year, over 60 athletes were named to the Centennial Conference's Academic Honor Roll, and several athletes were recognized by their sport's governing body as the best representatives of the nation's student-athletes. McDaniel College is the Home of Champions!

**INTRAMURAL SPORTS AT MCDANIEL**

The McDaniel College Intramural Sports program attracts over one-third of the student body throughout the school year for a wide range of recreational and competitive opportunities. ## DR. JOAN DEVELIN COLEY, PRESIDENT



McDaniel College President Joan Develin Coley has been an educator and administrator at the selective private, liberal arts college since 1973. She was elected president in 2000, and is the eighth president to serve in the College's 138-year history.

Dr. Coley is McDaniel College's first president to be promoted from the faculty ranks. She joined the faculty in 1973 as Director of the Graduate Reading Program and went on to serve as Dean of Graduate Affairs and Chair of the Department of Education.

She has crusaded to help students with serious reading disabilities. For 26 years she led a four-week intensive summer reading clinic for up to 100 elementary and middle school students from Maryland and Pennsylvania.

A native of Philadelphia, Pa., Dr. Coley received an A.B. with honors from Albright College and earned both her master's and doctorate in education from the University of Maryland. Dr. Coley's numerous honors include the 1989 Outstanding Teacher Educator in Reading given by the Maryland Council of the International Reading Association. She has published extensively, writing articles and reviews for national journals and has authored, co-authored and edited several books.

Dr. Coley is a member of the board of directors of Target Community & Educational Services, Inc., a nonprofit that provides community living, vocational and recreational services to adults with disabilities as well as a board member of the local Chamber of Commerce. She was recently elected a board member of Centerstage, Baltimore's leading professional theatre company.

In March 2004, she was named to the Circle of Excellence for being selected as one of Maryland's Top 100 Women three times by The (Baltimore) Daily Record. She is also a member of the Executive Women's Network of Greater Baltimore.

## JAMIE SMITH, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



James M. (Jamie) Smith became athletic director at McDaniel College on Sept. 1, 1999, a month short of his 36th birthday, after three years as associate AD at Loyola College of Baltimore.

Smith, who served the previous four years as executive director of the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association, was a four-year letterwinner in lacrosse at Cornell University. He went on to play a season of club lacrosse in Australia and spent three years (1988-90) with Baltimore Thunder of the Major Indoor Lacrosse League.

Smith joined the Loyola staff in 1986 as coordinator of academic and student-athlete services, rising to assistant athletic director in 1989 and associate AD in '96. He ran the department as interim AD from September 1990 to March '91. As head of the USILA from 1996 until 1999, Smith has oversaw the weekly poll, the All-America squad, and team selection for the annual Senior All-Star game. In '98 he chaired the Team USA Men's Lacrosse Team selection for the quadrennial World Games.

Smith grew up in Port Jefferson Station, NY, on the north shore of Long Island. He earned a bachelor of science degree in human development and family studies at Cornell and later added a master's of education in guidance and counseling from Loyola.

Smith and his wife Gayle have been married since 1987. They have two sons, 15-year-old Devin and 12-year-old Shane, and a daughter, 13-year-old Kerrin.

## DR. CAROL FRITZ, ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Dr. Carol Fritz, associate athletic director at McDaniel College since 1977, is one of the true pioneers in the rise of women's collegiate sports. As then Western Maryland's (now McDaniel) first volleyball coach (1968-89), she built one of the early national powers and rolled up a 575-134-3 career record, leaving her tied for fifth in all-time victories among Division III coaches.

Fritz led the College to five straight Middle Atlantic Conference titles (1976-80), to the national finals of the last AIAW tournament (1981) and to six of the first eight NCAA tournaments, beginning in '82. The American Volleyball Coaches Association named her Division III South Region Coach of the Year in both 1986 and '87. Meanwhile Fritz revived women's basketball at the College in 1967 after a 37-year lapse and served as its first softball coach. She went 32-13 in softball (1981-84) and 123-90 in 13 years as hoops coach (1967-80) including a 14-7 mark and her first division title in her final season.

Fritz, a West Chester (PA) University graduate, joined the Green Terror staff in 1967 while still working on her M.Ed. in physical education here. She went on to earn an Ed.D. at George Washington University.

Fritz, who doubles as professor of exercise science and physical education, served as president of the Middle Atlantic Conference from 1986 to 1988, and was on the NCAA's Membership Committee. Currently she chairs the Centennial Conference's Basketball Committee, and serves as a resource person for the Centennial's Executive Committee.

## BECKY MARTIN, HEAD COACH



She arrived at the Middle Atlantic Conference track championships in 1981 as a grad assistant, helping to coach the team while studying for a master's in education at Western Maryland (now McDaniel College). She left with a second straight gold medal in the high jump -- after winning in street clothes and sneakers. And without having trained for a solid year.

Becky Martin's surprising, spur-of-the-moment entry -- on orders from the head coach -- is just a minor footnote in a

remarkable career that has seen her become both the most prolific scorer and winningest coach in McDaniel

College basketball history. So noteworthy was her athletic career, McDaniel College inducted her into its Sports Hall of Fame in October of 2004, without the consideration of her numerous coaching accomplishments.

Martin, a multisport star at Westminster High, became McDaniel College's head coach in 1981, just a year after her graduation. Entering her 25th year, she's compiled a 345-233 record. She has led the team to ten league playoff berths, one Middle Atlantic Conference division title in 1985-86, its first-ever Centennial Conference crown and NCAA playoff berth in 2002, a feat she pulled again each of the past two seasons. Her team has posted a final mark of 25-4 in each of the past two years, and advanced as far as the Sweet 16 in the NCAA tournament.

After launching her career with three losing years, Martin has endured only two more since. In 1988-89 she won the MAC Southern Division Coach of the Year award after leading then Western Maryland College to a 20-5 mark. Her 25 wins a season ago set a new school mark for wins in a season, while the fifth victory of the year made her just the 36th coach in Division III to reach the 300 win plateau. Her team also picked up the program's 500th win in last

year's NCAA playoffs.

As a 5-9 center in her career, which spanned from 1976 through 1980, Martin became the team's first 1,000-point scorer (1,299), led Western Maryland College to its first league title (1979-80) and won the division MVP award as a senior. Despite having fallen to ninth on the all-time scoring list and sixth in rebounds, Martin still holds team records for scoring average in a season (23.0 in 1979-80) and career (19.1). She also still holds the mark for points in a game, having scored 39 against Ursinus in the final game of her career. Meanwhile Martin helped Western Maryland College win three straight conference titles in volleyball (1977-79) with records of 19-5, 30-5, and a best-ever 36-3.

Martin's experience has landed her on several committees, including the ECAC Division III Women's Basketball Mid-Atlantic Championship Committee. She is currently the chair of the Centennial Conference Women's Basketball Committee, and has served as the Chair of the College's Sports Hall of Fame Committee.

Rainier in Washington, rafted the Colorado River through the Grand Canyon, biked the 180-mile C&O Canal Trail, and snorkeled the Great Barrier Reef.

Her passion for travel and adventure is one that she passes on to her student-athletes. Martin has taken her basketball team and their families on a whirlwind tour of France for exhibition play and a heavy dose of sightseeing several times. Those trips included stops in Paris, Nice, and Normandy; however, Martin, a Westminster native knows she does not need to travel overseas for exploration. Living just a short drive from the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains, or the bustling city of Baltimore, Martin needs little more than the keys to her car to enjoy life to its fullest.

And enjoying life means taking chances and making good on her promises, even when it involves punching holes into her body. Trying to convince their coach during the preseason that a tattoo would be appropriate if the team won the conference, Martin bargained her self-described self-mutilation down to a cartilage ring before agreeing to the deal.

When the team made good on its half of the deal, Martin, surrounded by her team, added a ring to the top of her ear, and a Centennial ring to her hand.

## BRIAN HOLLINGSWORTH, ASSISTANT COACH



Born in Union Bridge, Maryland, Carroll County is home for Brian Hollingsworth. Like so many members of the faculty and staff at McDaniel, Hollingsworth enjoys the sense of family he has experienced here on the Hill. Perhaps that is because he has been coaching basketball for nearly a decade at the College, or it may have to do with the fact that four-fifths of his family either has, or is working towards a degree from the College. Whatever the case may be, Becky Martin is certainly glad to have Hollingsworth on the staff.

"Brian is the calming influence on our staff," says Martin. "When the pressure turns up, he becomes more laid back. That provides a nice balance for both Phil and myself."

Hollingsworth's background in athletics runs broad and deep. The former All-Carroll County selection on the gridiron showcased his talent on the football field at Salisbury University. There he received his Bachelor of Arts in Recreation in 1985. Upon his graduation, Hollingsworth returned to his high school, Francis Scott Key, where he coached softball until 2000. He also coached girls basketball at Key, running the junior varsity squad from 1985 until 1987 before taking over as the girl's varsity head coach. He held that position until 1994 when he arrived at McDaniel (then Western Maryland) as an assistant with the men's program. In 2000, Hollingsworth made the leap from the men's team onto Becky Martin's staff.

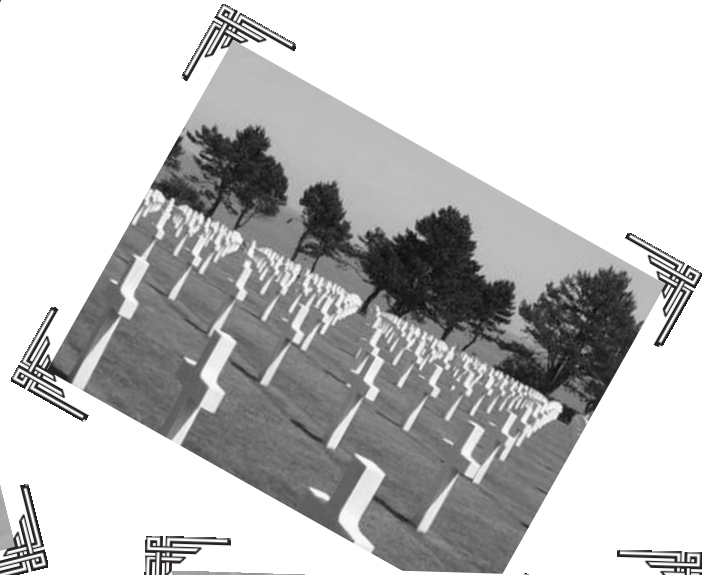
*Croissants and a Little Smile*

## 2005-2006 SEASON PREVIEW

Having laid claim to three out of the last four Centennial Conference Championships, and having a solid NCAA playoff showing following each has left Becky Martin's basketball team in the unusual position of preseason front-runner. McDaniel enters the season favored to win the Centennial according to the Conference's coaches, and ranked 23rd in the nation according to the voters at the Internet authority on all things Division III basketball, D3hoops.com.

Martin hopes her team doesn't buy into the hype.

"Those things are nice, but championships aren't handed out, they have to be earned," says Martin. "I hope this group doesn't lose sight of how hard it has had to work for everything good that has come down its path."

Now, clearly on the path of the hunted in the Centennial, the veteran coach has several holes to fill and a group of new faces to work into the fold. Unlike being the early favorite, filling in the spots vacated by graduation is a position that has been quite familiar to Martin since claiming her first Centennial crown in 2002.

"There isn't anything you can do to bring a player back, so the focus obviously needs to be on what you have. We have a lot of talent and heart on our roster"

That talent and heart is found in a pair of seniors, a stellar group of juniors, a rising star sophomore, and five new faces. And everyone on the roster has been stewed in the championship pressure cooker on either the high school or NCAA level.

Seniors Sara Franz (Catonsville, MD) and Kristy Costa (Galloway, NJ) have a pair of championship rings on their fingers, and were largely responsible for bringing those championships to McDaniel.

Costa is a pure athlete who is expected by her coach to emerge as a dominant force in the Centennial Conference this season. Twice the Centennial's Outstanding Field Performer in outdoor track, Costa averaged 11.7 points per game and 5.6 rebounds each night a season ago. That effort earned her All-Centennial second team honors last year.

As she stares down 1,000 points, the forward is being called upon to bolster her talent with the same competitive drive and confidence that lets her run away with the heptathlon on an annual basis.

"Kristy has all of the tools needed to dominate at this level," says Martin. "What she lacks is the belief that she has all of the tools. She still needs to discover just how good she can be."

Both seniors are going to be asked to be authoritative leaders.

Costa's classmate, Franz, possesses tremendous basketball knowl-

edge and presence that makes a leadership role a natural position for the guard. A marksman from behind the three-point line, Franz has uncanny court vision that also allows her to penetrate defenses to manufacture quality shots for herself or teammates down low.

"Sara is one of those players you need on the floor," says Martin. "She has a knack for making shots that spark runs when they are most needed."

Besides being McDaniel's captains, the Green Terror's seniors are the only returning starters. That doesn't mean McDaniel is without experience however, in fact the Terror roster boasts five underclassmen who averaged double-digits in the minutes column last year.

"This is the year that the junior class needs to take over the program and put their signature on it," Martin quickly points out. "In terms of talent and accomplishment on the high school level, the current juniors were the best class we have ever brought into the program."

Through its first two seasons, the class has provided explosive energy with each player fitting into a niche within the system. They are now poised to play a more prominent role in Martin's franchise.

Katy Powell (Smithsburg, MD - 7.1ppg/2.8rpg) is a gamer who plays her best in the big games, and her on-court personality will be ingrained in McDaniel's success going forward. That is evidenced by the fact that five of her eight games with double-digits came down the stretch of the season, including the career high 18 she scored at Scranton in the second round of the NCAA playoffs. Either Powell or Franz could slide into the spot at point guard which was left vacant by graduation, however, Martin does not want either in that role if it will hamper either's offensive production.

That may be where sophomore Robbin Gregg (Oakland, MD - 3.1ppg, 0.8rpg) steps in. She came to the collegiate ranks well-coached, and showed flashes of a brilliant future. Equipped with tremendous quickness and agility, the sophomore out of Garrett County set up shop in the weight room improving on strength that was already bordering on ridiculous for her stature.

The departure of Jacqueline Pundt leaves a physical vacuum under the basket for the Green Terror, but her absence coincided with the late season emergence of five juniors: Allison Biggs, Kara Delenick, Theresa Hess, Heather Thompson, and Amy Watson.

Biggs (Sykesville, Md - 3.4ppg, 2.3rpg) gives McDaniel presence at the post, and sees the court with the vision of a point guard. Her last second dishes often confound defenses that are forced to honor her shot on a drive to the basket.

Delenick played at the post in high school, but is undersized for the role collegiate post player. That said, whenever she is on the court, the ball just seems to end up in her hands. That occurs largely as a

result of her hustle, tenacity, and instinctive competitive nature. A gifted shooter and quality rebounder, Martin readily acknowledges that she and her staff must develop a way to take advantage of her skills and intangibles.

At only 8.9 minutes per game playing behind Pundt, Hess (Medford, NJ - 2.5ppg, 2.1rpg) may be the sleeper talent of the group. That's a distinction that won't last long. Outfitted with size and ability to score, Hess also plays a tough brand of defense, and will see a significant increase in minutes going forward.

Heather Thompson (Dauphin, PA - 7.0ppg, 2.7rpg) made tremendous strides offensively last year taking advantage of her deceptive speed. She quietly averaged 7.0 points per game in just 11.8 minutes on the floor in each contest. Thompson is another one of McDaniel's confident shooters in pressure situations.

Amy Watson (Lancaster, PA - 4.5ppg, 5.1rpg) was not asked to be a factor offensively on the prep level. Left in a role of cleaning up rebounds, she got her points without displaying her soft shot. That portion of her game has come along nicely throughout her college career without any adverse impact on her ability to gather loose balls under the basket. Alongside of Biggs, Watson provides a physical presence in the McDaniel frontcourt.

"This junior class needs to understand that their time is now," Martin emphasizes. "They need to realize that they can't look to the seniors for answers because two people can't do it alone. They are the players the younger players will be looking to, and it is time for them to make this program their own."

The freshman class looking up at this junior class brings with it the kind of credentials that the current juniors brought two seasons ago. They represent several State Championships, as well as a few thousand points and rebounds. All five of McDaniel's freshmen were captains on the prep level.

Jamie Morningstar (Poolesville, MD / Poolesville) was her high school's all-time leading rebounder, and racked up a bevy of post-season honors during her four-year varsity career. Kim Staub (Hanover, PA / Delone Catholic) played a key role in Delone Catholic's trio of Pennsylvania State Championships, and like Morningstar, has plenty of individual honors to boot.

The Green Terror will also welcome Toni Tagliareni (Annandale, NJ / North Hunterdon) and Lauren Wyble (Severna Park, MD / Severna Park). Tagliareni captained her team to a 21-9 record and a ninth place finish in New Jersey as a senior. Like the rest of her incoming classmates, Tagliareni captured plenty of post-season honors. Wyble is another highly decorated freshman who averaged more than 14 rebounds a game as a senior. She graduated from Severna Park High School as the top rebounder and First Team honors from the *Washington Post* and *Baltimore Sun*.

Because of a preseason knee injury, Terror fans will have to wait a year before Danny Fraider (Newtown Square, PA / Notre Dame Academy) is unveiled. Fraider laid claim to several tournament MVP awards, and host of post-season honors, including All-Main Line First Team and All-Southeastern Pennsylvania Honorable Mention.

The load of incoming talent promises that recent success will continue into the future, but with the level of play and parity in the Centennial Conference, Martin knows there is no time to rest.

"There are enough good teams in this conference that we need to be ready to play every night," stresses Martin. "The race for our Conference's championship is wide open. Preseason polls don't account for the time it takes for players to mesh or the battle of attrition that occurs throughout the season. We are back at square one in terms of chemistry."

How quickly Martin concocts her brew of success with her available ingredients will determine where McDaniel will be standing when the Conference dust settles.

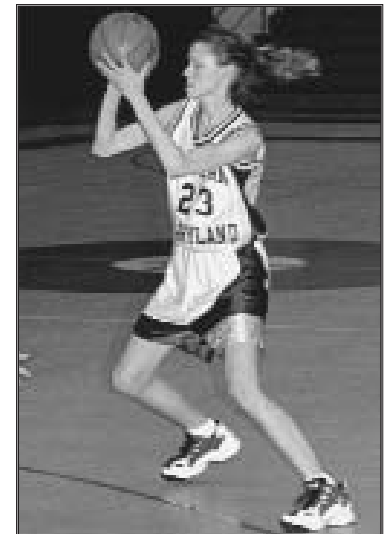

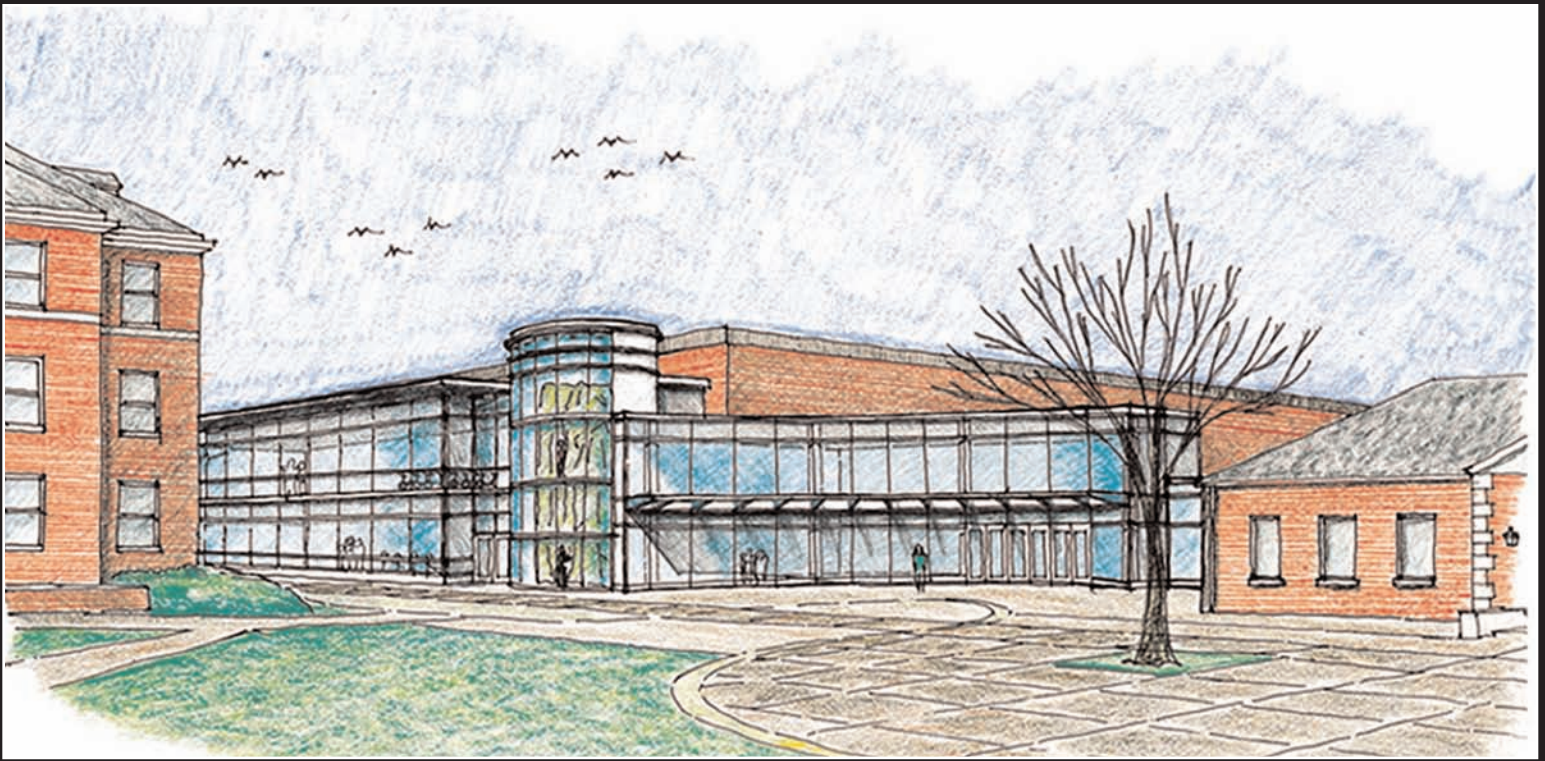
